

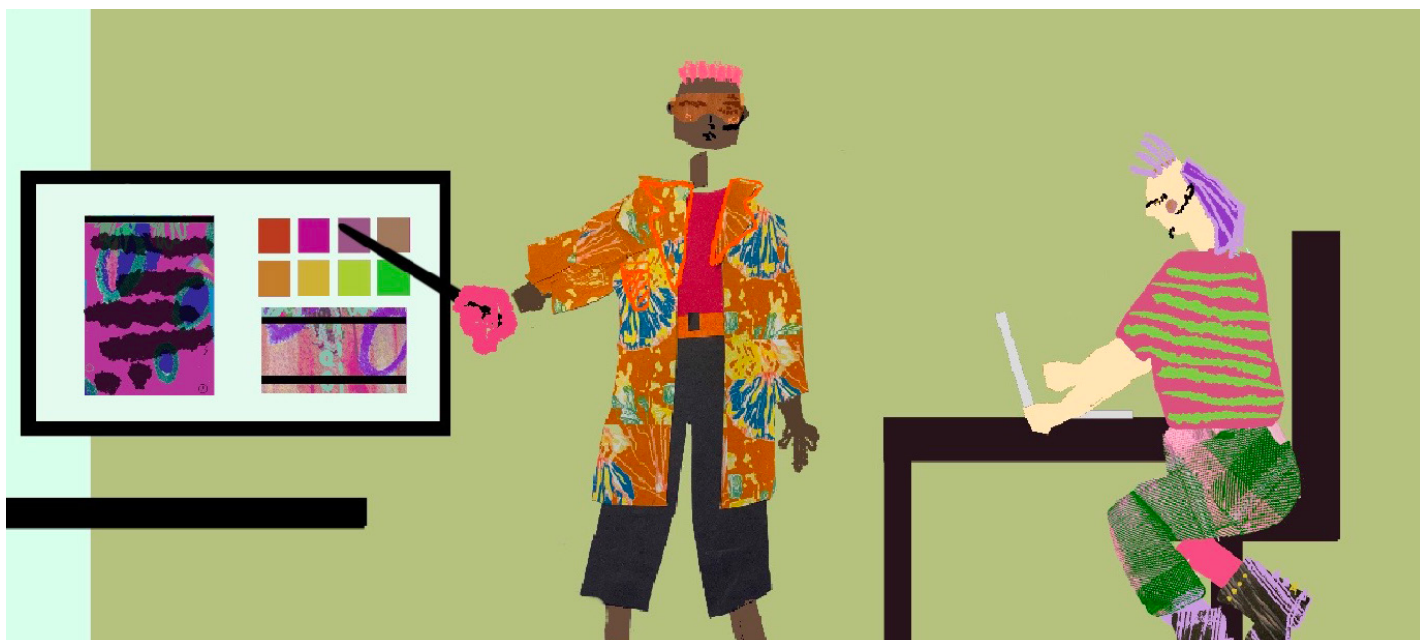

How to write to employers for job opportunities

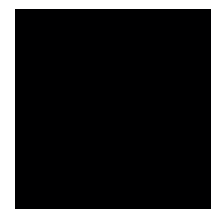

Definition

- **Speculative application:** Where you contact the company directly to introduce yourself, your expertise and services. This is in the hopes of forming a connection and getting a job at the company.
- **Speculative role:** A role that is not advertised publicly.

Structure

When you contact an employer looking for a job opportunity, follow this structure in your messaging:

What	What opportunity are you looking for?
Why	Why do you want to work for the brand? What is the brand's unique selling point that captured your interest?
Who	Who are you? What skills can you bring to the role and brand? Why do the brand's values align with your own?
When	What is your availability to have a conversation or potential interview? Are you available permanently or temporarily?
How	Attach your documents to showcase how your experience is relevant to the role (CV, cover letter and portfolio)

Tips for writing a speculative application email

- **Effective email subject lines:** Think about what will grab their attention and focus on their need as a brand
- **Put your best foot forward:** Introduce yourself and demonstrate your knowledge of the brand
- **Summarise your skills:** Match your experience and skills to the brand's values
- **Perfect your tone of voice:** Professionally show your enthusiasm for the brand and tailor your tone to match theirs
- **Short but sweet:** Keep your application email messaging to no more than 250 words
- **The goal is to get a response:** Remember you are hoping for a response to organise a meeting to discuss further, do not expect to be offered your dream job straight away

Speculative application timeline

Research everything:

- The brand
- The people
- The types of roles within the team
- The brand's values
- What excites you about the brand

Prepare your tailored documents:

- Your messaging
- CV
- Cover letter
- Portfolio (if applicable)

Find the most direct route and send your application:

- Use LinkedIn to find the department manager of the area you wish to apply for
- Email or message them directly with your application, ensuring to address them by name



Follow up

- After 2 weeks of silence, follow up with a gentle chase message
- In your message, be polite and ask if they had time to review your previous email
- Acknowledge and understand that they may be very busy
- Confirm that you are still available to discuss further
- Offer to answer any questions they may have about your expertise

Ask for feedback

- If you get a short response acknowledging your effort but no continued path, ask politely for feedback and whether you can be contacted should any new vacancies arise

Track your progress

- Keep on track of how many applications you send and the style of messaging
- You'll start to see patterns of what worked and what didn't



Speculative application email examples

Example 1

Subject: Fashion Journalism graduate available for meaningful copywriting and content

Hi Jo,

I hope you've had a good week so far.
